Seasonal /Supply Update: UK Heritage tomatoes and berries in season. We are monitoring the situation in the Mediterranean area where very high temperatures there are currently being recorded. Temperatures of the magnitude predicted can cause crops to cease growing leading to later gaps in supply or quality problems. UK Grower update: Continued humid or wet weather has hampered some harvests. Please be aware this week that for open, field grown products such as leafy salads there will be an increased risk of field debris (soil, insects, etc.) inside leaves so please be extra vigilant during washing and preparation. Crops will also be very delicate and prone to bruising during handling/packing due to their high moisture content. This should only affect the outer leaves in most cases and growers may cut with extra layers to compensate for this. Please be assured that once these outer leaves are removed, general appearance should be good.
