UK carrot finished, imports will see us through until new season English begins around end of June / beginning of July. Parsnips will also move over to imports within the next couple of weeks. UK Broccoli delayed slightly, now due end next week. UK growers seeing an increase in weeds, insects & soil in crops due to recent wet weather so please be extra vigilant to remove any debris when washing heads of lettuce and babyleaf salads.
